

Wednesday, January 28

- 11 - Took a stage load down to St. George to hear Rev. B. Stoffe's lecture on the Pennsylvania Dutchman. Dehorned 6 young calves.
- 13 - Sold 1 calf 3 mo old weighing 300 lbs @ 8¢ per lb. \$24.00 took it to St. George station and brought home a load of bran etc
- 14 - W. Galbraith and I went to Williamsone for tea.
- 15 - Drew out manure making sixty loads in all drawn out.
- 16 - Started to cut chestnut nuts at the bush.
- 1829 - Stayed in the house most of the time with Sadie & Grace.
