

Broton May 1888

Tue May 29 cloudy and warm part of the day
hauling out manure and part washing
sheep. there was a little rain last night

Wed May 30 clear and cool. we were drawing out
manure to day.

Thu May 31 cloudy some rain. I was trying to
shoot crows part of the day and part of
the day planting in corn that the crows
and birds have pulled up. Walter was
drawing away the rails we had to
make the pen for washing sheep.

this has been a cold dry month. the
wheat and grass is very backward and
poor. Spring grain is needing rain
and warm weather very much.

Fri Jun 1 clear fore part of the day and cool. a
frost last night cloudy this after noon
and showers raining this evening
we were hauling out manure.

Broton. June. 1888.

Sat Jun 2 rain last night. flying clouds to day
wind from the North and cool. a prospect
of a frost to night. we were hauling out
manure again to day.

Sun Jun 3 clear and cool a sharp frost last night

Mon Jun 4 clear and pleasant. we were hauling out
manure a few loads to scrape up and we
shall be through. Mr Skinner shored the sheep

Tue Jun 5 clear and warm. I was up manure
in the fore noon. Walter was drilling in beans
for Mrs Bowen until near tea time
from that we finished getting out manure

Wed Jun 6 cloudy this fore noon after clear and
high wind. Walter commenced to cultivate
corn. I was planting in corn where it
failed to come on account of the drouth.

Thu Jun 7 cloudy in the morning and cool. clear and
warm the latter part of the day. we were work-
ing on the road with the team.
