- 18 Jack & Elen went to church in Brockville heard the Revd Mr Morrison preach
- 19 heavy rain most of the day I am very sick took an emetic
- 20 Jack went to Betty to look at land it is good but old Mr Bath is dead he died yesterday
- 21 Jack Granpa Walter Luce & sis went to John Yonges to Mr Bath's funeral he was buried at Dublin the boys cut the barley
- 22 cut & bound some of the seed hay rain finished Jack went to Colman's Mill with 11 1/2 bushel of fall wheat & 1/4 of corn
- 23 Jack & the boys cut & drew up the grass seed & stook it up in the field front of the house that finished Hay for this season Jack very sick
- 24 the boys went through turnips with horse & cleaned pithy weed the Revd Mr Mills preached in cantown
- 25 thrashed fall wheat for seed
- 26 Jack & I saved thrashed a little more wheat & chenned it had 9 1/4 bushel of seed wheat
- 27 began to cut the oats below the house brock A finger & put in another
- 28 finished cutting the little oats
- 29 began to cut the Spring wheat in the field South side of the Road poor crop there was very heavy rain last night and the house of Henry Weeks was burned up last night Mullony & his family came near being burned upon it they lost their all
- 30 heavy rain this morning went to Brockville packing a barrel of suit paid \$8.9 got harkens for sack and went to Brockville to the Sweeney's Jack Margaret & Elen four days
- 31 worked at the wheat Jack & the boys and the boys
