Estimating Venous Pressure.

The sphygmomanometer with its arm-band is attached to the upper arm in the manner usual for blood-pressure determinations. A similar arm-band is attached to the forearm and registers changes in the volume of the latter. The pressure in the sphygmomanometer, that just suffices to produce a swelling of the forearm, marks the degree of venous pressure.—Frank; Zeitschr. fuer exp. Path. und Ther.
