- Sat 24 Milk 50. bread 22
- Sun 25 General fund 25
- Mon 26 2 loaves 22 coal oil 25
- Tues 27 hen feed corn 30 lbs 100
- Wed 28 Jannie went to Cornwall. Some telephone business I sold to Jannie 2 shares for 10'00 3 to Farquhar, and he sold 5 more for one \$50<sup>00</sup> in all I could not take a new share
- Thurs 29 School cards unspected. And soon in it to go to Cornwall to their H. School inspection
- Frid 30 2 loaves 21 doughnuts 26 Flora Christ down for Isabell 47
- Sat 31 Milk 50. Hen feed corn - 30 lbs 1.00 1.00
