- 12 Toronto I was boiling tomatoes for Ketchup
13. Girls came home this evening. Bot beef 50^{cts} 50
- 14 Very fine day rather hot - Lacrosse at Lancaster
- 15 Lovely day, almost too hot -
- 16 Jimmie left for Toronto 11 A.M. began to rain about 11 A.M. rained all day. Had a nice Lodge meeting, about 15 present -
- 17 Still raining, had look-out for Catholic Pic-Nic which will be on the 19th
- 18 At 10 A.M. it began to clear up. Now 8.30 P.M. it looks like frost. I have just returned from prayer meeting, fixing Murdy's shoes 25⁼ 25
19. Cold day, high wind, not many at the pic nic. Bird & boys were there gave Murdy and Ran. each 25^{cts} (a cold marriage license to Boby Robert McL. to Mary Ann McKay on Wednesday 17th 2^o the 18th)
- 20 Ugly day, cold rain
- 21 Bot 3 lbs sugar 25^{cts} - nutmeg cinnamon molasses 50
- 22 High wind roads drying not many in church
- 23 Far came home 3.30 A.M. yesterday morning Bot 5 lbs raisins at Willis 60 cts. Jimmie came home this evening, was at the Lodge, had a good time Bot 5 1/2 bush lime 1.38 1 38
- 24 Very fine day, we took up our roots Bot 20 lbs beef 1.50 = sugar 25⁼. Murdy got Gordon this afternoon and finished mowing the buckwheat; had Ferguson yesterday mowing Harriet McGillis Mrs I. Bowie was buried in R.C. Cemetery here today Last week there was a great calamity happened in the City of Dubee, part of the cliff fell and crushed a number of houses, killing & wounding the inmates
