- 5 Fine dull day. I made a large washing
Doest put in one load of hay
- 6 The Concert came off in St Andrew's Hall
It was well attended
I borrowed \$3.00 from Murdy, got 1⁰⁰ of sugar 1.00
Rained all forenoon To 4 loaves 20 20
- 7 A very heavy storm of thunder & lightning accompani
by heavy rain took place about 2 P.M.
- 8 Heard that at tree at D. M. Robertson, and
a number of telegraph poles west of the village
were struck by lightning yesterday
Sent off the coupons for the picture competition. Reg. charge 9
To 4 lbs of butter at Jurbert's 1⁰⁰
- 9 Fine day, Jimmie sold Fraser two loads of hay today
Doest brought a jag of hay. I think that will be
all from him, Jimmie has, Fraser, John Kenneth and
an le Rignon working. It is a very fine day
- 10 Jimmie has Fraser today. They finished the hay
The bale of goods we ordered from Calvis came
gave Major 30^{cts} for bringing it from Lancaster 30
To bread 20, 2 cans of salmon 15, Breakfast food 25 70
- 11 Fine day, Charlotte MacLennan came here last
night. She is going to sing a solo today
To Sunday off 15^{cts} 15
