MONDAY, 8

Dr. Harris gave us our second lecture in Organic Chemistry which was as long as usual to get out. Attended my other classes as usual to day.

TUESDAY, 9

A grind in our Chemistry which came pretty hard for some of the boys. But I managed to escape. Did tolerably well in my other classes to day for a wonder.

January WEDNESDAY, 10 1866

Had a pretty hard time to day on my French class which I think some of Johnny Composition & rhetoric in a talk. Bought a ticket for the season skating on Chateaus Rink.

THURSDAY, 11

January SATURDAY, 13 1866

SUNDAY, 14

Attended class meeting this morning at nine o'clock, and church at eleven o'clock. I heard the Rev. Chas. Doan's preach and a lecture in the afternoon from Dr. Steller. on Thought.

MONDAY, 15

A exceedingly cold day, not so cold, however, as to hinder me from my work. Had an excellent lecture in Organic Chemistry to day. In the afternoon I wrote out my Chemistry notes etc.

January TUESDAY, 16 1866.

WEDNESDAY, 17

Storm not over yet, but con-
ditions much of the day; had a

I went out for a walk in the snow.

THURSDAY, 18

Attended a lecture in organ-
ic Chemistry this morning, went
out with Will. Cooper for
a walk, after which I studied
until church time when I
heard the Rev. Chas. Jewell

January FRIDAY, 19 1866.

Good old Friday for ever! Attended
my classes this morning as usual.
After prayers went out for a walk
with Bates after which I wrote
a letter home & on to the College
bag, which was the last walk ^{Friday} of the

SATURDAY, 20

After prayers this morning I
went out for a walk with Bates
for half an hour or so; after which
I studied until dinner time, after
dinner I sawed some wood & in
the evening studied & wrote a letter.

SUNDAY, 21

Attended class meeting this evening
in my room after which we went
to church. Had a short walk
with Frank Livingston after dinner
after which we spent the evening
in conversing on various subjects.

January MONDAY, 22 1866.

Attended my class this morning
at 9 o'clock. Dr. Davis gave us
a lecture in chemistry etc. Had

three until five, eight, & then had a

Attended lectures in Geology
and Chemistry as usual. Spent
the day out, starting from two
to five and from five to seven
studied & after this
studied from eight until ten.

WEDNESDAY, 24

Had a lecture in Chemistry
this morning, preceded, probably,
with in part the classes to day.
Wrote my notes on chemistry after
dinner after which I had a
good sleep for a couple of hours.

January THURSDAY, 25 1866.

A very stormy day. In day, atten-
ded my classes as usual. Spent
my notes on chemistry after dinner.
Went out for a walk afterwards.
Commenced studying about 8.
& continued until eleven o'clock.

FRIDAY, 26

A lecture this morning on Chemistry
and also on Geology. Went out
walking with Lewis after dinner
and talk about four, work out my
chemistry notes, and had a very
pleasant skate on Mitchell's rink.

SATURDAY, 27

Spent the forenoon in studying
and the afternoon in writing letters
to the females of N.H.S. went
out for a skate with Lewis and
had a fine time studied my
lessons until bed-time etc.

January SUNDAY, 28 1868

Spent the morning in reading Benjamin's Religious Progress. Attended church at 11 AM where the Rev. Colton preached. Had a walk after dinner with brother. Heard the President (Jones) preach at 7 PM.

MONDAY, 29

Received our last lecture in Organic Chemistry this morning. Attended to my other classes as usual. Wrote and my notes on chemistry after dinner after which I went out for a skate for Mitchell's Bank.

TUESDAY, 30

Attended the grand in chemistry this morning. Had a lecture in Geology went out after dinner with Peter. Had a very pleasant walk; after which I studied most of the time until 9 o'clock.

January WEDNESDAY, 31 1868

Examination in chemistry this evening. Attended my other classes as usual. Had a very pleasant walk after dinner with the Rev. Mr. Rowson after which I studied until 10 o'clock, then I went to the masquerade at Mitchell's Bank.

February THURSDAY, 1

Attended my classes this morning as usual. Went out for a skate in the afternoon and had a pleasant time. Studied from 5 to 10 o'clock when I went to church and heard the Rev. Mr. Kelton preach.

FRIDAY, 2

Spent no chemistry this morning & had a lecture in Geology etc. Spent a part of the afternoon skating at Mitchell's Bank. Called the Misses Rowson this evening with the Rev. Mr. Rowson. Studied from 6 to 9 o'clock &c.

February SATURDAY, 3 1866.

Went out this morning, before prayers, for a walk, attended prayers as usual. Had a very pleasant time skating this afternoon on Chestnut rink, after which I wrote a letter home & one to the H. St. College.

SUNDAY, 4

Attended the Episcopal Church this morning in company with W. W. Probst. Spent most of the afternoon in reading the Pilgrim Progress. Heard the President of the Conference preach at night.

MONDAY, 5

Attended my classes this morning as usual. Had a lecture in Electricity for the first time. Went out for a walk after dinner, after which I skated until half past seven when I attended an excellent love-feast.

February TUESDAY, 6 1866.

Attended a lecture on electricity this morning, and, as usual, attended classes as usual. Made my electricity notes after dinner after which I had an extra good skate until 5 o'clock, when I went home & skated till bed time.

SUNDAY, 11

Spent the morning in reading the Bible & Palmer's Progress. Went to the Presbyterian Church at 11 o'clock where I heard the Rev. Mr. Loring preach. Heard the Rev. Dr. Robinson lecture in the evening.

February MONDAY, 12 1866.

Read usual Church service where
I heard, Wm. Rev. R. Jones, President
of the Canada Conference, preach. Had
a short walk after dinner, spent the
remainder of the afternoon in reading.

MONDAY, 26

Attended a lecture in electricity this
morning, other classes as usual. Went

Went to the Methodist Church this morning. Heard President Jones preach to the Soldiers. Spent most of the day in reading my bible and some other books. Attended the Methodist Church to night.

Attended another lecture in Electricity this morning. Other classes as usual. Went out for a walk after dinner. Went out for a walk after dinner, and worked till six in company with Johnson, Carol & J. Kingsbury & C.

TUESDAY, 27

Examination in electricity this morning. Went to bed at eleven. Read a whole page line. Went out after dinner for a walk with Russell, Smith, & Jones. Heard them six times. Walked until six. Studied until bed time. & C.

WEDNESDAY, 28

Dr. Hayes gave us another lecture on electricity this morning. Herlog & C. as usual. Wrote out notes in E. bible and continued. The work after dinner in Phil. Wrote. Went out for a walk. Still in with Will. Studied from 6 till bed time.

March THURSDAY, 29 1866

Attended a lecture on the electricity this morning as usual. Wrote out my notes on electricity before prayers. Went out with Wells & Carpenter for a walk. Went to church last night & heard the Rev. Geo. Ransom preach.

FRIDAY, 30

Went up by Port Hope this morning in company with Wells & Carpenter. Called on Mrs. Griffin & spent the afternoon with her & Miss Griffin and Miss Biggs. Had a very pleasant time. Got home by noon.

SATURDAY, 31

Attended prayers this morning at seven. Saw the volunteers depart from Port Hope for their homes. Spent most of the day in reading over my Geology. Went out for a walk after four. Called at Parker a few minutes.

April SUNDAY, 1 1866

Went up to see Parker this morning. Went to the Catholic church at Port Hope. Had a very pleasant walk after dinner with the Rev. Mr. Spring. Attended the Public School church this evening.

MONDAY, 2

Studied until noon when I attended the Rev. Mr. Spring's lecture on electricity and Geology. Wrote out my notes before prayers. Went out for a walk after dinner after which I cut some wood. Spent the evening in reviewing my electricity & Geology. Cleaned.

TUESDAY, 3

Attended one of Harrison's recitations at seven. Dined quietly this morning. Also a lecture on Geology which was quite interesting. Went down to the photographer's for dinner and had a very pleasant time. Walked until six. Studied until ten.

April WEDNESDAY, 4 1866.

April SATURDAY, 7 1866.

Went out for a walk with Henry after prayers. Spent the remainder of the forenoon in reading. Went out afternoon for a walk. Called on one of my lady friends near St. V. C. Went up to the station at half past nine.

SUNDAY, 8

Spent a few hours in reading. Went to church this morning heard Mr. Adams preach. Went out after dinner with Mr. Sprague for a walk, up the old Pelletough. Heard the Rev. Mr. Jones preach this evening at C.

MONDAY, 9

The Dr. gave us another lecture this morning on C. Attended Geology as usual. Wrote out my notes on electricity before prayers. Had a walk with Mr. Condit. Went to the mill room for a few minutes at C.

April TUESDAY, 10 1866.

Dr. Harris gave us our last lecture on electricity this morning. Commenced our review in Geology. Went out with Dr. Harris before prayer. Got a letter from home so didn't write at a supply of him, &c.

WEDNESDAY, 11

Attended an examination in electricity this morning, also in Geology. Went to P. M. & for a walk with Sprague before prayer. Had a short walk after dinner. Spent the evening in reviewing.

THURSDAY, 12

Another examination to day in organic Chemistry. Had Geology for several reviews. Paid up several little bills to day and came out square all around. Spent the afternoon in walking. In P. M., studying.

April FRIDAY, 13 1866.
