Thursday, January 1, 1874

A Beautiful day, almost like Indian Summer, drawing wood to wharf in morning, went to L.L. Bogart's in Evening.<sup>1</sup>

Friday, January 2, 1874

Warm and threatens rain, drawing wood in afternoon.

Saturday, January 3, 1874

Thawing all day and the snow is going very fast, no sleighing at all on the road. drawing wood to wharf.

Sunday, January 4, 1874

Quite mild, the snow nearly all gone, weather about like middle April. heavy wind towards night. Wrote Uncle Wilson & Uncle Bristow.

Monday, January 5, 1874

Quite warm & pleasant. Went to Adolphustown. Ice very poor.

Tuesday, January 6, 1874

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Lewis Lazier Bogart (1804-1888), uncle of Kate Bygott. At that time, L.L. Bogart was still living in Adolphustown. Later, he would move to Napanee.

Snowing this morning. Threshed a flooring, Rye. Storm turned to rain. Went to C. Roblin's<sup>2</sup> in evening. Staid all night.

Wednesday, January 7, 1874

Rained hard all night & freezing, Roads quite Icy, drove home this morning.

Thursday, January 8, 1874

Thawing all day. fixing Freds stable. Nancy McWain died at 5 o'clock this afternoon.

Friday, January 9, 1874

A Beautiful day, warm & pleasant, sun shining bright. Commenced to rain in Evening.

Saturday, January 10, 1874

Squally, went to Nancy's funeral with Buffy[,] Arch. Campbell & wife & Stinson & wife. Staid all night.

Sunday, January 11, 1874

A light fall of snow last night -- weather moderate. Mr. Meacham preached Missionary Sermon. turned cold towards night.

Monday, January 12, 1874

Froze hard last night. Cleaned up Rye this morning, threshing Oats in afternoon.

Tuesday, January 13, 1874

Cold -- cutting wood in morning. Missionary Meeting in Evening.

Wednesday, January 14, 1874

Attended School Meeting & defeated 4th Conc. a fall of snow last night & this morning. Head ache all around the board.

Thursday, January 15, 1874

Very cold last night -- clear cold to day [sic].

Friday, January 16, 1874

Fearfully cold last night, the coldest night this winter & to day continues the same. Threshing Oats.

Saturday, January 17, 1874

Weather more moderate. Not doing much today. A. Haight & Huff dropped in this Evening.

Sunday, January 18, 1874

A Beautiful day. Phillip & Ann over, threatens thaw.

Monday, January 19, 1874

Heavy rain last night & this morning. Snow nearly all gone, colder towards night.

Tuesday, January 20, 1874

Froze Hard last night, Ice solid this morning. threshed a flooring Rye. J.H. Trumpour & Wife here to day.

Wednesday, January 21, 1874

Snow last night, raining to day, expect the snow will all go again.

Thursday, January 22, 1874

Rain & fog this morning, snow all gone.

Friday, January 23, 1874

Heavy rain this morning, cleared away at noon, freezing towards night, chopping all day.

Saturday, January 24, 1874

Went to Roblins. [sic] Ice only moderate. Commenced to snow & continued all day. Heavy wind & no sleighing.

Sunday, January 25, 1874

Quite cold, at home all day.

Monday, January 26, 1874

Fearfully cold last night & to day -- drawing wood to wharf. Snowing.

Tuesday, January 27, 1874

Not quite so cold, got 3 shoes set at at Huffs -- snowing nicely. This afternoon had an Invitation to Outwaters.

Wednesday, January 28, 1874

Snowing lively this morning. Cleaned up 16 bush. Rye & took 13 to Sproule. Drawing wood to wharf in afternoon.

Thursday, January 29, 1874

Drove to Napanee. Snowing all day & quite cold. Lou had a narrow escape yesterday from Poison.

Friday, January 30, 1874

Very cold to day. Headache. Old grandma died this morning. Chas. [Lang] here.

Saturday, January 31, 1874

Very cold indeed. Bellevilleites drove down to dinner & over to 4th conc. in Evening.

Sunday, February 1, 1874

Intensely cold. Attended Old Grandma's Funeral. Mr. & Mrs. Wilson & others here to dinner.

Monday, Feburary 2, 1874

The weather continues cold. drawing wood to wharf. snowing towards night.

Tuesday, February 3, 1874

Milder & snowing a little, drawing wood to wharf.

Wednesday, February 4, 1874

Threshing Rye. Went to Sam'l Hawleys in Evening.

Thursday, February 5, 1874

finished threshing Rye -- weather continues cold.

Friday, February 6, 1874

Weather cold. drawing wood to wharf in morning, cleaned up 25 bush. Rye & went to J. Sobeys in Evening.

Saturday, February 7, 1874

A very cold day & snowing a little. Chopping in woodhouse in morning &

drawing to Wharf in afternoon.

Sunday, February 8, 1874

Weather continues cold. Kate gone to Church. I staid at home.

Monday, February 9, 1874

Quite Moderate to day. drove to Trumpours but they were not at home. I commenced to cut straw -- attended a cheese meeting.

Tuesday, February 10, 1874

A beautiful day. drawing wood to wharf. Went to John Huyck's in evening -- a small snow storm.

Wednesday, February 11, 1874

Quite cold to day, drove over to Phillip Drewry's[.] Stickles and [Height] left for Stirling.

Thursday, February 12, 1874

The weather continues cold -- drawing wood to wharf.

Friday, February 13, 1874

Raining heavily this morning & continued all day. Snow going very fast. Bay watered through, foggy, hope it will turn cold.

Saturday, February 14, 1874

Cleared away. drawing wood all day[.] Got a letter from John Bygott & son, two Valentines, & Kate got a present of Cake Basket.

Sunday, February 15, 1874

A Beautiful day "At Home" went to church in Evening.

Monday, February 16, 1874

Weather Moderate. Windy, am cutting snow, sleighing getting scant. drawing wood to wharf 7 cords. Man killed in Napanee.

Tuesday, February 17, 1874

Very cold to day, threshing Rye. Mrs. Dowling & son came down. Uncle Bristow died to day.

Wednesday, February 18, 1874

Rather cold, not pleasant, drove over to [L.] H. Trumpour's.

Thursday, February 19, 1874

A little more Moderate & threatens rain. drawing wood to wharf.

Friday, February 20, 1874

Rain last night. Cleared away this morning. Drove over to Phillips & they were away - went to Mr. Collin's in evening. Sleighing very poor. Uncle Bristow buried.

Saturday, February 21, 1874

Rain & sleet to day. drove over the Bay & got 30 bush. 45 lb peas @ 70 cts. [cents]

Sunday, February 22, 1874

Rather pleasant. J.C. Bogart & Consider Dowling drove down after their [prows] drove Ice.

Monday, February 23, 1874

Raining this Morning. Very Heavy Wind. drove to Roblins, 2 Horses & 26 bush Peas. Ice only Middling.

Tuesday, February 24, 1874

Quite cold this morning. Ice hard but not thick. Drawing wood in Morning -- went to Roblins in afternoon, double Team.

Wednesday, February 25, 1874

A little milder. Snowing a little. drawing wood to Wharf, 12 cords.

Thursday, February 26, 1874

A little colder to day. drawing wood to Wharf 11 cords.

Friday, February 27, 1874

A Beautiful day, drawing wood in the afternoon.

Saturday, February 28, 1874

Mild & pleasant. Threshing Rye in Morning. went over to Trumpours in afternoon & got my cows.

Sunday, March 1, 1874

A fine day, looks a little like storm. John Collins & Marsh & company here. went to Church in Evening.

Monday, March 2, 1874

Warm & pleasant. threshing Rye all day. They are driving the Ice to Napanee yet but I think it is poor.

Tuesday, March 3, 1874

Quite warm to day. Ma walked over the Bay -- Teams falling through Ice in Napanee River. finished threshing Rye & commenced Wheat.

Wednesday, March 4, 1874

Heavy rain last night turned to Snow this morning, threshing Wheat all day, freezing hard towards night.

Thursday, March 5, 1874

Quite cold this morning. Driving Hay Bay with 2 Horses. Channel opening here. finished threshing Wheat.

Friday, March 6, 1874

Very cold to day, freezing hard & snowing a little in afternoon. finished cleaning up Wheat.

Saturday, March 7, 1874

Rain last night. Milder to day and raining hard at intervals. Joe cutting wood for summer.

Sunday, March 8, 1874

Quite cold to day at Home all day, no service at Church.

Monday, March 9, 1874

Very cold indeed. Blowing & Snowing roads are fearfully rough -- drawing wood to Wharf in Morning. Kate gone to Cyrus Roblin's.

Tuesday, March 10, 1874

Intensely cold. Cleaning up Rye & packing away summer wood. Marsh Bogart brought Kit home.

Wednesday, March 11, 1874

Colder to day than yesterday. Cleaning up Wheat. Capt'n of the "Norman" here -- fearfully cold tonight.

Thursday, March 12, 1874

The Weather remains as cold to day with hard cutting Wind. Packing away summer wood.

Friday, March 13, 1874

As cold as ever. For more than a week we have had severe weather, and the ground being exposed, the damage to fall grain & clover it is feared will be great.

Saturday, March 14, 1874

A little more moderate this morning, and getting warmer, through the day. Quite pleasant in after'n with a dripple of Sap. Trimming piles.

Sunday, March 15, 1874

A beautiful day. At Home this morning. John & Libbie Roblin called in afternoon. drove to Church in Evening with Cutter.

Monday, March 16, 1874

A fine day. Getting out buckets, soaking on the Ice and drew them out to Woods in afternoon. [Mate] Roblin married tonight.

Tuesday, March 17, 1874

Rain last night & threatens it to day. tapped 275 trees, sap running pretty good.

Wednesday, March 18, 1874

Quite warm and no frost last night. finished tapping and gathered 100 pails sap. Commenced to rain in Evening.

Thursday, March 19, 1874

Heavy rain last night & raining to day. boiling to day.

Friday, March 20, 1874

Heavy frost last night. Sap not doing much, too cold. gathered 100 pails of rain water & sap & sugared off 40 lbs.

Saturday, March 21, 1874

Heavy wind to day. White caps are rolling to day. Cole ferried somebody in small Boat. boiled down & had 3 pails molasses gathered 440 pails sap.

Sunday, March 22, 1874

Quite cold to day. drove to Church. The roads are fearful to day. Phillip & Wallace over.

Monday, March 23, 1874

Froze very hard last night & to day is fearfully cold with hard cutting Wind. Boiling all day.

Tuesday, March 24, 1874

Very cold indeed. The Bay is frozen over. Sowed some grass seed & Boiled sap and sugared off 60 lb.

Wednesday, March 25, 1874

A very cold day, with heavy wind. took load of Rye to Tubbs. Snowing furiously towards night.

Thursday, March 26, 1874

Raining this Morning. Sap running a little, gathered 140 pails in afternoon.

Friday, March 27, 1874

Quite cold to day, boiling all day & gathered 80 pails of sap in the afternoon.

Saturday, March 28, 1874

The Weather continues cold with squalls of snow, boiling down to day. Green burnt up 170 pails of sap last night.

Sunday, March 29, 1874

Still remains cold. at home all day. Young Star calved. too cold for sap. got a letter yesterday from J. Boldrich & Jim Bygott.

Monday, March 30, 1874

A very cold day. Went to Napanee with grist & got 1/2 ton Corn Meal. Wrote Father, & Boldrick. paid latter [131.43 ct.]

Tuesday, March 31, 1874

The weather continues cold. Sugared off 14 lbs sugar. P.L. went over the Bay & got 2 cows.

Wednesday, April 1, 1874

A very nice day. Went over to 6th town & bought a Roller &c. broke Ice 1/2 way over the Bay.

Thursday, April 2, 1874

Cold Rain & Wind. Went to Tubbs with Rye & got Cider & Harrow. Bay frozen over This Morning.

Friday, April 3, 1874

Cold to day, with heavy wind. The Bay is clear of Ice. Got my Roller & Cider Mill home. Gathered 130 pails sap & boiled in afternoon.

Saturday, April 4, 1874

A very cold day. finished boiling. hand 5 pails Molasses. Phillip & Ann over.

Sunday, April 5, 1874

A Beautiful day, not quite so cold. At Home all day. Snow Storm in Evening. J.G. Collins & Marsh to tea.

Monday, April 6, 1874

A Beautiful day. Piddled around in morning. Sugared off 45 pounds in afternoon.

Tuesday, April 7, 1874

A light snow last night. Mate Wycott called to day. Sap dropping a little.

Wednesday, April 8, 1874

A fine morning. gathered 110 pails sap to day & boiled down. The Bay was skimmed over this morning.

Thursday, April 9, 1874

Warm & pleasant. drawing rails in morning. sugared off in afternoon. Sap running pretty good.

Friday, April 10, 1874

Snowing this morn. gathered 200 pails sap & boiled down 100.

Saturday, April 11, 1874

A light fall of snow this morning, sugared off about 30 lbs. Red cow calved.

Sunday, April 12, 1874

A Beautiful day but rather cold. At home today.

Monday, April 13, 1874

Hard frost last night -- too cold for sap -- sugared 30 lbs. Killed calf. Drawing

out poles in afternoon.

Tuesday, April 14, 1874

Much warmer to day. gathered 180 pails sap. a nice shower rain in forenoon and light showers in afternoon. boiling down all day.

Wednesday, April 15, 1874

Warm and raining. finished boiling down and sugared off 60 lbs in afternoon.

Thursday, April 16, 1874

Frost last night. Warm to day. "Str. Norfolk" passed on her first trip about 12 o'clock.

Friday, April 17, 1874

Gathered 80 pails sap & boiled into Molasses. drawing stone & poles for fence. Light snow storm in afternoon.

Saturday, April 18, 1874

Quite cool in morning. drawing poles for fence in morning & stakes in afternoon.

Sunday, April 19, 1874

A beautiful day. At home all day. Mr. Daly staying here to day. Headache at night.

Monday, April 20, 1874

Raining this morning. Cleared away about 3 o'clock. gathered 9 0 pails sap & Rain Water.

Tuesday, April 21, 1874 drawing wood & boiling down got 30 pails more of the mixture & realized

althogehter 8 galls. Molasses. Bunched up Buckets.

Wednesday, April 22, 1874

light frost last night. A Beautiful day. putting away buckets & sided up Sap House. Mate Roblin moved away on Str. Norfolk. Kate went to Napanee.

Thursday, April 23, 1874

light frost last night. Chilly this morning. drove to McWains & got seed oats. Fixing fence in afternoon. A light shower in evening.

Friday, April 24, 1874

frost last night, warm & pleasant to day, building fence. Phebe got off "Norfolk" to night. A young lamb to day. Got a letter from Lizzie.

Saturday, April 25, 1874

frost last night. A fine morning, tried to plough (too wet) cultivated behind barn, fixing fence in afternoon, rain towards night.

Sunday, April 26, 1874

Snowing this morning. Cleared away fine in afternoon. Wrote to Frank.

Monday, April 27, 1874

Frost last night. Fixing fence. "The Shannon" commenced to run. Set 3 hens.

Tuesday, April 28, 1874

Heavy frost last night. Fixing fence. J. [McHenry] paid me \$20.00.

Wednesday, April 29, 1874

Heavy frost again. Cold north Wind. Fixing fence in morning, clearing out cellar way in afternoon.

Thursday, April 30, 1874

A very cold day with heavy wind. Working at Wharf in morning. Commenced to plough in afternoon.

Friday, May 1, 1874

Quite cold to day. ploughing all day. P.L. gone to Napanee. Joe picking stone. Headache at night. Frost last night.

Saturday, May 2, 1874

A light fall of snow. Ploughing this morning. Sowed 3 bush. Wheat in afternoon. Kate gone over to M.C. Bogarts. raining.

Sunday, May 3, 1874

A lovely day. Walked over to Church. Mr. Peterson & Aunt Mary here to dinner.

Monday, May 4, 1874

A very fine day. Ploughing year's fallow. Turned out Fred & Mary in upper Wood. Sowed 2 1/2 bush Wheat, 10 bush Tares & Oats.

Tuesday, May 5, 1874

A splendid day. Sowed 5 1/2 bush Wheat. "Str. Picton" went up to day.

Wednesday, May 6, 1874

Quite cool this Morning. Sowed 4 bush Wheat. finished harrowing in afternoon.

Thursday, May 7, 1874

A light frost last night. ploughing all day in wharf field. Quite cool to day.

Friday, May 8, 1874

A Beautiful day, & cool. ploughing all day. light headache at night. threatens rain.

Saturday, May 9, 1874

A Beautiful day. finished ploughing Wharf field & garden. Rhoda calved. sent Albert "Butter Nut" Tree.

Sunday, May 10, 1874

A Warm day. At Home all day. Phillip & Ann over.

Monday, May 11, 1874

Pleasant but dry. Sowed Wharf field with peas & planted a few early [Rose] potatoes.

Tuesday, May 12, 1874

Quite warm to day. fixing fence in woods, ploughing orchard in afternoon.

Wednesday, May 13, 1874

Fearfully hot to day. Kate & son gone to Napanee. finished ploughing orchard & commenced over road.

Thursday, May 14, 1874

Wind North, cool. Warm in afternoon. ploughing all day. Carried out my potatoes.

Friday, May 15, 1874

A beautiful day. ploughing and sowed Barley in orchard.

Saturday, May 16, 1874

Very warm. finished dragging & rolling Orchard. Sowed some Oats & Peas in afternoon. A slight shower of rain about 2 oClock.

Sunday, May 17, 1874

A little cooler. drove to Church and took dinner at Lewis Bogarts. Tea at Cyrus Roblins. rain towards night.

Monday, May 18, 1874

Had a beaugiful rain last night, a light misty rain this morning. fixing fence in afternoon.

Tuesday, May 19, 1874

Nice and cool this morning. Ploughing all day.

Wednesday, May 20, 1874

Warm & threatens rain. finished ploughing this morning and finished dowing this afternoon. Kate went to Napanee & got Milk Can.

Thursday, May 21, 1874

Beautiful rain last night and to day rather cold. Cleaned out Cellar &c.

Friday, May 22, 1874

A beautiful day. picking stone off Meadows. Took roller to Huffs to repair.

Saturday, May 23, 1874

A fine day. Broke my roller planting carrots, when after seed corn & got Walmsleys roller & finished field by barn. R. Lowson came down.

Sunday, May 24, 1874

A very fine day. Threatens rain. Dick and I went over to Phillips & to church in Evening.

Monday, May 25, 1874

Rather cold and raining, cleared away at noon, heavy wind. fixing fence in afternoon. Prospect good for crop. sent Milk to Factory.

Tuesday, May 26, 1874

raining a little puddling around the premises in morning, ploughing sod for corn in afternoon. P.L. put fire in Lime Kiln.

Wednesday, May 27, 1874

Ploughing in morning & finished for Corn. Sick in afternoon. Joe picking stone.

Thursday, May 28, 1874

Very warm to day. Ploughing for potatoes.

Friday, May 29, 1874

A little cooler. Rolling to day. Jim & son came down to night.

Saturday, May 30, 1874

A warm day, rolling & furrowing out ground for potatoes.

Sunday, May 31, 1874

Quite sultry. Thunder shower in afternoon.

Monday, June 1, 1874

Cool & overcast. went to Napanee on Norfolk planted cucumber & melons in

evening.

Tuesday, June 2, 1874

A Beautiful day. Harrowing & furrowing corn ground. finished planting potatoes. Huffs Mare got badly hurt.

Wednesday, June 3, 1874

Overcast & cool. planted corn, cucumbers, & melons. looks very much like rain.

Thursday, June 4, 1874

Very warm & overcast, ploughing out back for Corn. Headache in afternoon. Killed calf.

Friday, June 5, 1874

A fearfully hot day. Ploughing out back finished.

Saturday, June 6, 1874

A fine morning. had a beautiful rain to day, everything is growing magnificently. "Shannon" "came out" and beat the "Norfolk".

Sunday, June 7, 1874

A splendid day. No service today. Philip & Ann over. Got paper from Cornwall.

Monday, June 8, 1874

Quite warm to day. Ploughing for Buckwheat. headache at night. Lib Roblin here to tea. Shipped 150 Cheese.

Tuesday, June 9, 1874

Quite pleasant. drove to Keeche's & cheese Factory. washed sheep in afternoon.

Wednesday, June 10, 1874

A beautiful day. Ploughing in young orchard.

Thursday, June 11, 1874

Overcast and threatens rain. Ploughing. Commenced to rain towards night.

Friday, June 12, 1874

A beautiful rain last night. drove to W. Joyces & got \$6.2 cts. [sic] finished ploughing for Buckwheat & early Western Corn.

Saturday, June 13, 1874

Cloudy and quite cold. drove to Napanee. Exchanged Milk Can for 40 gall. brough home bird. Kate got a letter from Ellen.

Sunday, June 14, 1874

A pleasant day. Heavy wind. At home all day.

Monday, June 15, 1874

A fine day, has the appearance of rain, sheared the sheep and sowed 1 bush. corn [note added later] and 2nd month

Tuesday, June 16, 1874

Overcast & cool. Ploughing summer fallows. commenced to rain at noon & rained all afternoon, best rain of the season.

Wednesday, June 17, 1874

Quite cool. Ploughing all day, ground a little stickey.

Thursday, June 18, 1874

A beautiful day, cool and pleasant. Ploughing all day.

Friday, June 19, 1874

A very warm day. Ploughing. Drove Mate Roblin home at noon.

Saturday, June 20, 1874

Weather quite warm. Ploughing summer fallow.

Sunday, June 21, 1874

Warm as usual. drove a fellow up to Keechs and over to Cyrus Roblins in afternoon. Young preached his farewell Sermon.

Monday, June 22, 1874

Weather continues warm. fixing fence in little meadow, line fence in woods.

Tuesday, June 23, 1874

A little cooler and showery. fixing line fence between Huff and little meadow and cleaning up bushes &c &c.

Wednesday, June 24, 1874

Ploughing out back for corn, cut Jim a little with Harrow. Weather a little cooler.

Thursday, June 25, 1874

Quite warm & overcast. Threatens rain. sowed 2 bush. corn & ploughed a little. Phillip & Nancy over. Showers in afternoon.

Friday, June 26, 1874

Heavy rain last night and this morning. drew stone on road.

Saturday, June 27, 1874

A beautiful day. broke stone in morning. the dredge came in to Wood & Mr. Daly to---

Sunday, June 28, 1874

A very warm day. Drove to Church but no service. Jake & Phoebe over, three sisters went over to Phillips.

Monday, June 29, 1874

Overcast but very warm. finished sowing corn in little meadow & ploughed in afternoon. Chas Barager took boat here this morn'g.

Tuesday, June 30, 1874

Heavy rain all day. ploughing. went after Huff's bull.

Wednesday, July 1, 1874

Dominion day. A delightful morning. Working up Buckwheat ground & picking ... [sic] Herrick Boat "Pacific" launched at Roblin's.

Thursday, July 2, 1874

Quite warm to day. ploughing for B.Wheat. Joe hoeing corn. Headache in afternoon. An old settler at night.

Friday, July 3, 1874

A delightful day. Ploughing young orchard, cool & pleasant. Kate gone off with the <u>dappled</u> greys to a funeral on back bay. Appearance of rain.

Saturday, July 4, 1874

ploughing until 10 O'Clock when the rain commenced with Heavy Thunder, a beautiful rain. piling manure in the afternoon.

Sunday, July 5, 1874

A beautiful day and the crops look splendid after the rain. At home all day -- got a letter from Mother -- J.C.Y. Cornwall arrived.

Monday, July 6, 1874

quite warm in morning. ploughed Jim for first [time] since cut. Went to Huff's stone bee in afternoon. J.C.Y.C. went to Belleville this morning. appearance of rain. Kate gone to Mill Point.

Tuesday, July 7, 1874

A beautiful morning. Shannon passed at 5 o'clock. finished ploughing for B. Wheat. Sowed 1/2 bush. Corn. Thunder Storm with heavy wind.

Wednesday, July 8, 1874

A Beautiful day, drove to Mr. Joyce in morning and sowed Buck Wehat in afternoon. Fearfully hot.

Thursday, July 9, 1874

A fine morning. Picked stone off young Orchard & cross harrowed. The sky threatens rain. Ma gone to J.H. Trumpour.

Friday, July 10, 1874

Warm & raining a little -- hoeing in garden in afternoon & picked [3210] Potato Bugs.
