Post-Operative Suggestions.

9. Water should be given as soon as practicable and frequently. A thin cereal should generally be the first food, and should be given two or three times a day.

10. Severe pain from after dressings should not be allowed, if it is possible to prevent it.

11. Patients should not be allowed to sit up or get up until the blood-pressure is shown by actual measurement to be nearly, if not absolutely, correct for the individual. Whether or not cardiac tonics should be administered must depend on the individual patient.—J. A. M. A.
