Hard frost last night. Sunny day cool. We spread 3 loads manure from pigeon with spreader on No 1 then plowed along E.P.R. fence opposite No 5 to bank up to fence. James Hannah and Fred Ford here in AM making an appraisement of value etc of the 2 sheep we got killed on E.P.R. on Monday the remainder to-day last of them. In P.M. Willie harrowed No 6 4 horses then I sowed some, commencing at barn, with Ligona oats 2 1/2 bushel to acre and grass mixture in proportions by bulk 2 parts Timothy 1 part red clover 1/4 part each mammoth & alsike at rate of 9 lbs to acre. Andrew Shortland brought two cows Judith June bred at 4 cts. Credan at 3/4 to go Saturday got 5:00 on them. Sold to Schario butter 6 lbs \$1.44. We have to date 27 lambs and 21 sheep we let them out to pasture today that is the sheep with lambs first time.

Thursday

Fine sunny day. Frost last night. Girls drove down in morning to see rug Jim Russell was to bring up to Father. Mary came up again got at Mills meat 55¢ for butter \$2.59. In P.M. she went down again and they both came up at night paid for corsets Patterson's \$1.25 gave to Annies man 25¢ to sent to Dounbann for potato \$2.25 postage etc 10. Mr Cass here for tea brought Lombard plum and Cumberland raspberries \$1.50 I planted plum in new orchard: eggs at Armstrongs yesterday on apr \$2.25 curtains at Russell's 60¢. Edward Youngson was found dead yesterday on S.L. shot in the head. Bessie had 12 pups last night smoothed 3 to-day. I sowed rest of Ligona oats to-day all sand hill and over to near cherry tree. We dug some of I drain spread manure heap in No 1 etc.
