  - 28 Kemp tuned the piano and the organ had two keys cleaned. paid for organ 50 cts 30
  - 29 Fine day. Turned very cold after the rain of Wednesday. made a fire in kitchen
  - 30 Cool and lowery. Old John McTherson was buried yesterday. He did not get over the amputation of his hand. And Siders had a baby boy yesterday. To 1 lb sugar 1.00  
1 pan bread 20. 1/4 lbs butter 25 steak 30 75
- on Saturday the 30<sup>th</sup> fine
- July 2<sup>nd</sup>. News of a fire in the shipping at New York three vessels burnt to the water edge over three hundred persons perished. burnt and drowned. In one vessel (the Saale) a great number were down below and their exit was cut off. they stood at the portholes until the vessel sank, and they were drowned. The three vessels were the Main, Bremen, and Saale. Twenty millions dollars worth of property destroyed
