Sat Jun 9th Clear part of the day and hot. cloudy this Evening. I was working on the road in the fore noon after noon was taking the lumps of the corn where it was cultivated. Walter was drawing sawdust on the road finished our road work this Evening.

Sun Jun 10th thunder Showers through the day. heavy rain last night. which was needed.

Mon Jun 11th fore noon cloudy and cool. after noon clear and pleasant. we were planting in corn where the crows had pulled it out and hoeing potatoes and carrots.

there was considerable damage done North of here by the hail yesterday.

Broton, June. 1888.

Tue Jun 12th clear and warm. Walter was cultivating and I was hoeing corn.

Wed Jun 13th cloudy a light thunder Shower this after noon. we were hoeing corn to day.

Thu Jun 14th cloudy part of the day and warm. rain last and rain again this after noon with heavy thunder and sharp lightning. we were hoeing corn part of the day.

Fri Jun 15th light clouds and hot. heavy thunder and sharp lightning last night but little rain we were hoeing corn to day.

Sat Jun 16th clear and hot. Walter finished cultivating the lower field the first time. I was hoeing we have the field hoed a little more than half way over.

Sun Jun 17th clear and very hot.

Mon Jun 18th clear and hot. we were hoeing corn

Tue Jun 19th clear and very hot. we were hoeing corn again to day.
