## Atropine in Tinnitus Aurium.

Weissenberg calls attention to the good results occasionally obtained from atropine in this affection when its origin is unknown. The author used it empirically and having seen a good result continued its employment with very few negative experiences. Wittmaack has recently stated that some tinnitus ought to yield to remedies which modify the circulation. Atropine has of course an affinity for the blood vessels, which is exhibited in several well known ways. The author prescribes the drug as follows:  $\mathcal{R}$  Sol. atropinae sulph., 0.01; aquæ, 15.00. S. Ten to fifteen drops three times daily.—*Deutsche med. Woch.*
