Passive Movements in Elbow Injuries.

Failure to recognize the pernicious effects of early passive movements in elbow injuries leads to continued inflammation of the joint and protracted stiffness from increased adhesions and callus formation, and may result in a severe degree of permanent disability later. Passive exercises may be usefully employed when the range of movement is increasing.—*Shen-ton; The Lancet.*
