Saturday Scotch Moon came in stormy Charles Ross came in with my Flour and a Bag of Potatoes gave or sent a soft Evening for the Rasy Cold Frost small cake of Maple Sugar to his Mother Cold and stormy
7th Sunday a Fine Day cold some sound south West after last nights squall and Blyster North East Gordon went down to see the Ross 13th a Fine Day but cold and Windy the Marsh I throw Sunday Or Quinquagesima 8th Gordons B Dohay all Doric only what on the stable left a Very Fine Day East Wind Went down to the shagreen and that's wanted there the cut of vines Island and from there down to the Kit Kit Island Done down to the ground commenced feeding I thought it was the track of a Wolf I seen the good hay to the cows and sheep sharp very large where I could see it no Fox tracks the cropcut saw it cuts muddling were cut a Water hole outside of the bushes in the for anet old file to sharpen it Dined the channel as there is Wigglers close to shore Fine shave its an awful time with Wind and cold some and Frosty 9th Frosty Blowing as its a Cold Weather Frosty 14th St Valentines Day that every Day Fined the Fire shovel sharpening the saws Wrote a Letter to John Care of Woburn set and Filed the cropcut a Part of it some Travelling N York City Direction on the inside of the 16th the Lancaster Road 10th Ash Wednesday Frosty some Cold Windy Ab feeding all the cattle sat no meat to say as its one of the days I dont eat good hay from 15th During stove wood cutting Meat this Day and good Friday Made 2 sticks for the hay on the flow cold Drifting stormy cutting up Barn Door and a Mob a great Deal of Travelling on the head 16th a little moderate but cold and Windy the Lancaster to Salmon River going and coming the William La bellette for a load of Marsh hay though Moon in Penzer today we will have a change and its off home to crops but I did not go fixing the Caves needed as its being cold I may stay since ch this copy sowing and taking some of the cyphers years Day with the exception of a Day or two Crops out of it as its too thick some long bunch a Day 11th the first Fine Warm Day we have had the Lancaster Road to say tras pers 13th Draining this some time its Thawing snowing hard south to the Light house to say 17th Cropped to 14 ponds Bought 10 Ponds 10 yds of glass 14 yds of cotton at 8 West Wind and North Wind all around the Sea Bottom 25 cent Shovel 1 dollar whole spot The compass the Wind is to Day went to the Black spool White thread Black thread Postage on Letter trying the old cropcut saw W C Fishers come down sent a Letter to John a Fine Day and a very stormy Day Before the Door went to the North side of the Island I Summers went for saw logs to the Bush/Scrub 5 of them a good many Travelling on the Lancaster took Eaton heard Tom's Wife had a Daughter last Road Blowing and snowing Mr Reynolds and Vass here week John Hammett talking to me about the Stone Sold Ross to Got 25 Dollars Bought saws to the Light house Frank Laplante over 9 Bunches of Fishing Lines for about 20 cents thru the River Working at the Prime 18th James Hughes Started for Lancaster went to the foot of the plain North Day I went to 16 ponds Bought Repper Tobacco cold Found it to Wild cold and stormy turned Back to a Bunch of Newspapers from Hamilton that Stopt all night its and awful Wicked night some one left for me with Drifting

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
