Infections of Fingers and Hands

1. Never hunt for pus with a probe in this portion of the body, as it may spread infection.
2. An incision should be made through the point of infection, giving free drainage.
3. If pus is secreted about or in the joint of a finger, pressure on the end of the finger will give rise to pain, while if the pus is in the sheath of the tendon, the same pressure will cause little or no pain.—Garner; Detroit Med. Journ.
