About 4 P.M. there was a storm of thunder and lightning and heavy rain D.R. McDonald has a political meeting in St Andrews Hall this evening. Mosquitoes rampant

31 Rain again I was in church. my off 15 Mrs Peter Conie Grant Le Con Front was buried here this afternoon. J. McDonald called James Falkner his wife and his mother called. Far came about 7.30 P.M.

7 Fine day. A pretty large aggregation My off for Wefend 1.50. J.P. and Birdie were down. Agnes and Randy have had the mumps, they were not down Jimmie got 1 lb butter at Hillies 25 1.50

8 Fine day. The boys were up early. This is the day of the Election of a Member to the Provincial Parliament 5.30 P.M. the poll is closed and D.R. McDonald is in for Member. To 4 loaves 24

9 Very hot and Mosquitoes very bad. To 15 oz butter 25 I hoed some in the garden 3-63

On the 6th Mrs Santimo paid 2.75, On 8th Mrs Pedgen paid 3⁰⁰
