Cold day wind north flurries of snow ^{fall} all day fine and light amounting to nothing - scarcely covering the ground did little jobs such as fixing her windows tight and secure for the winter for Mr Loran at night

Cold, and exactly the same sort of a day as yesterday at Mr. Vanhorn's to night remained there till the next day, and Mr Vanhorn and myself spent the day hunting we had a long tramp but we enjoyed ourselves very much, ~~after~~ after we returned home we partook of a lovely stewed Chicken prepared especially for us we did justice to it
