- 13 Fine day. McDonald from St Raphael came to work at fixing the burn he is to board at Comel John's Rev Kenneth preached for us in afternoon
- 14 no longer mending
- 15 Was up early for mcs. milked before six began to rain about 4 to 9. now 5.30. to 9.00
- 16 Put at Wallis sugar \$1.00 flannel 10.50. 2 third 1-60
12 lbs maple sugar 15- 3 yds muslin net 24 39
There was a big storm of thunder, lightning and wind and rain yesterday. It broke an apple tree that was on our lawn, and moved the burn about three feet east, and shattered it a good deal. The storm came on about 3.30. P.M. rained for about an hour. Great Rain again. 70 yds flannel 25. paid. Frank 25
Morse 14.00 for some honey I got last week
Perfect bread in oven Got the flour from Wallis yesterday 2.10 per hundred 11
- 17 Pulled all the fruit. 12 currants 3 pails 1/2 gall red currants 2 pails gooseberries. Mrs Withers & Mrs J Callanach called, and so did Lizzie Brown & Mrs W Tail. Murphy got home 3 men all week working at burn
- 18 Fine day. Birdie boiled all the currants and gooseberries. 70 lb sugar at M. Cronin 1.1
70 lb wool oil. Paid Montroy
Paid Pullmore
McDonnell 1.00
- 19 Birdie went in evening to see Hutton from B. Lippi & Mrs Tail - her to tea and D.B Mc Lennan & Charlotte
- 20 Rained half of night and most of today
- 21 I was up early and got ready for Mrs Kennedy to come and wash. She did not come so I had the pleasure of doing it myself
Birdie is cleaning the parlor. On Saturday 5 lb butter at factory

- 22 The papers are full of the cyclone which passed over Winchester Linch & Onabrook on Thursday 17th. There were six lives lost 12 people injured, and the loss of property will amount to 500,000
- 23 I worked in garden in forenoon 7 to 2 of soup 10
- 24 Rain They are getting up the plates on the burn
- 25
- 26 70 lb muslin 50. The burn is ready to begin shingling. Got the factory report and pay 3.05
- 27 Fine for a while then showers, Graham had two screens
- 28 rain this morning. He washed. Bird done the white clothes. The colour of flannel Cowie Major began to shingle the burn we have but M. Don & longy today
- 29 Fine day Birdie & I called to see D. J. Mrs Rodgers, who are visiting at D. J. Falkners
- 30 Another fine day. McDonald left yesterday morning. Paid him up \$17.50 in all. His board cost \$7.00, which he pays
Cealyle was paid yesterday for the 20,000 shingles \$57.00 John Montroy is masonry the burn today. Carbor waiting on him
9. P. M. a heavy shower about 8. D. Roy's girls Kate & Finnie came when the shower began. 70 sugar 22 lbs \$1.00 Machine oil 10
1 yd flannel 11. 1 lb currants 10
- 31 Some day. The beginning of week 5 lbs rolls at factory.
Began to rain about 8 P.M. and there was some heavy showers
