Fred Arthur drilling on his father & Arthur helped  
Wed 13 Marjorie baked bread, seasoned up & finished  
up a kettle of chills sauce that was cooking all day  
yesterday had no sugar or spice. Maggie & John came  
Paul cutting their corn Marjorie finished her  
mustard pickles, Arthur drilling & his father  
taking the manure from the spout, he cut 22  
tho she he watched the cows in forenoon  
Thur 14. hot weather is changed frost last night  
I on 88 corner here we bought 5 bush native herbs  
I fixed the wood house changed things around to  
I could get the bran emptied. Marjorie washed  
a lot of her own clothes. I had a chat after  
she calved down the back road when I came  
back Maggie was here he got Marjorie in lady  
up by tomorrow I their waggon I go after peaches  
she did not come until nearly 2 o'clock had  
in our breadery at Pusters I go to hunt peaches  
after that got back after dark caught on the  
rain had some thunder I was afraid we were

going to have a bad storm. Arthur & Hattie went  
to Sheppawa with John & Maggie Peaky went on to  
Drummondville got something done in her teeth then got  
a basket of Peaches & rode home with them  
Marjorie had two baskets one 50 the other 35. had 5 bush  
bushels @ 22 to the got sugar 25 sea 18. coal oil 90 940  
on the book after the vent I churned nearly 2 hours  
Paul cutting marsh grass in the afternoon guarded  
the cows in forenoon yesterday afternoon finished  
Wells corn 11 shocks. Arthur drew up their  
pumpkins & squash in the forenoon  
Sat 16. I worked the butter then went. at the last of  
the large tomatoes we got from Mrs Peck then went  
after the peaches the Crawford 5 fans & one of the  
white. then came two fans of fair of tomatoes. I was  
just about roasted. the day was so hot started  
in rain towards night when I 5 fans of Plums  
& skin the milk Well gave me a pumpkin & squash  
Marjorie swept the room & washed the dishes & peeled  
some peaches to steam for Sunday. Eon Bannerville  
brought our mail Paul swept the school house  
when he was watching the cows after dinner he  
cut marsh grass  
Sunday 17 gloomy most of the day & hot. wind  
night thundered in the distance & rained fast  
after the cows were milked got our shoes dry  
on time. it has poured sin is dark its rain  
pouring yet. Clara & I on in the other house  
and one in bed. Arthur in the barn Marjorie & I lay in
