- 28 Fine. Still cold wind, sowed some herb seeds
- 29 Fine. Still dry vegetation very backward, We got a few potatoes planted that is all
- 30 To 2 loaves 12 milk 35-
- 31. Sent 1.25. to church

From 2/11. Dec 30th 1914
 Jimmie paid tax as by cheque

June 1914

- 1 Monday
- 2 Ann Hall, 57^{cts} sold 3 doz 10 eggs at 20, got soap 25- 25
- 3 Kings birth day. The Governor General, Duchess & Princess, and Prince were in Cornwall for a few hours. The boys were both up. Mrs Christie called, and had dinner To 2 loaves 12 wda 5- 19
- 4
- 5 Murdy paid 3.⁰⁰ I loaned him
- 6 Paid milk 35- 2 loaves 12 37
- 7 Fine day sent 25 to church 25
- 8 Courier took blue potatoes up and cleaned them. Sold 1 bag potatoes to Mrs Stewart - 75^{cts}. Mrs John Lavidette paid \$5.⁰⁰ for two months rent. Duck brought out 5 little ducks
- 9 Hot today Ann 1/2 day 50^{cts}
- 10 Mrs D. Larogue took 2 bags of potatoes 75 each 1.50 to be peiced in milk
- 11 Threatening rain every day. Mrs Christie sent me 11 tomato plants and some astor plants
- 12 To 2 loaves 12 Jimmie paid Burgess for the milk 1.80
- 13 Fine day To 2 loaves 12
- 14 I was in church for the 1st time since Jan 7 Sunday off 25 John P. and Agnes were down
- 15 Fine day but cold. Jimmie left for Toronto for 9. P. M train
- 16 Fine cold day (Jimmie took my cheque for 170.25 to Bank \$150. each 20
- 17 Bright cool day O. M. Crimmon paid cheque of \$40- Mrs Pantons paid \$8.⁰⁰ in bills for back rent
- 18 Heavy rain 2 loaves 12 Miss M Gullway here
- 19 Cold after the rain
- 20 Jimmie left for Alexandria, took Murdys horse To 2 loaves 12
- 21. Fine day I was in church. off 25
