Drug store Pink Root 12^½ Hoarhound Candy 2
Bought qt. of Bag 25 a treat at Tyos
Bought of Mr. S Long 1^½ yds of Cloth. Bought
smallman Binding 1st Heard Cormaneel. Womack
charted got a Ride down to Hopkins Point from
Livers Father as he is drawing wood from
it Agrees to him Races in Dundee slept
at Jo took Supper there Mr Leslie there
at James Lee's Prize 13 St. Wallhead 24th Day
cold in the Morning & W turned soft came from
Hamiltons snowing raining wind South West
drew some Wood one of my Eye's tie the
Nose turned cold to night 26th very frosty and cold the
7th cold & frosty fixing a handle in the acre W Wind
8th Sexagesima Sunday cold & frosty Drifting Marsh hay
done only about 1^½ tons on the stable lost 6 Wind
of all Area St David's Day the Festival of the Welsh
flies came in like a lion very cold and frosty high Wind
rest chopping Stave Wood commenced the West Mow
driving all the cattle fine hay a piece of hay on the North
side yet but mainly in the back place to night
cutting Brush in the oak field cold Windy snow
drifting North Wind and South West Wind 3rd W Wind
ever went to Hamiltons got a Letter from
his son in Grants worth a Dollar in it got the
same in Cornwall
