 Uncle John's B Day 1803
 Fine W Wind Mr Kelly Mr Morris
 Mr Hubbard Mr Shetla here
 I treated me to a Glass of good
 Fluff Seizing the Succas Fernes
 Took Dinner Left a Dollar for
 the girls very fine Mr Kelly
 caught a Surge Lots of Boats
 going to Fine Rufus Cream and
 George and John Morris here
 went fishing George went to
 Rufus stopt Mowing a field
 in the Barn Mowed 13 Corts of hay
 Rained to night

James Cameron Island July 18th 1854
 a very warm Day & Mowing at
 the Foot of the Island & Patted the
 Cattle the Richless came out
 19th Fernandez B Day 1874
 a very Fine Day awful warm
 Mowing at the oak by the Tree
 and making coals I went
 Down with a Raft one of them
 turned Back Passengers Boats
 awful crowded going these Days
 20th a very Warm Day Mowing at the
 oats and the Butternut Trees on the hill
 Making and Making coals a small
 steam yacht at cedar Grove fishing Bogar
 to Blow hard to night and Rained very
 hard Thunder and Lightning to night
 21st Battle of Bulls Run & Wind Raining
 Mowing at the Wet Place and ash
 Leander crossed for the Mail Gordon
 came 22nd a very Fine Day to Shetla
 and 2 Men here fishing Sent them
 our lines Moses Lemay here fishing
 23rd Fine & W haltering day Made a
 Stack at the Butternut Hill Put
 out a good many Tobacco plants
 Bohemian went up with Mowed
 Randolph here going to Montreal
 Leander went to Lancaster with him
 Leander went to Summerstown
