Tachycardia.

T. C. Janeway says where great tachycardia sets in acutely, in cases of well-compensated mitral disease, the tachycardia can be controlled by digitalis within forty-eight hours, with complete relief of symptoms. Even under long-continued digitalis medication such patients may maintain a fair working ability for years. Treatment must be instituted before marked dilatation of the right heart and general venous stasis have occurred.—*Arch. Int. Med.*
