I had to stop for awhile to drive a herd of cattle into a lot of Sam Law's wheat. I took Buck and he chased them into the woods, so I suppose they were Art Ryrees. Shuby had more time and to look after us didn't get over till after dinner. I got up at four o'clock this morning but went to sleep saying my prayers and slumbered peacefully till nearly five. Tom Abbot told us this morning that Edna Sidway isn't expected to live.

Saturday May 23<sup>rd</sup>

Dad and I got a fairly good day's work in on the land to-day. He harrowed and I disked. I am part way over it cross ways and have the disks set in the last hole but one except on the sand knoll. It makes them big. John Wess was over for a long time this morning talking to Dad. He is working on his buck wheat stubble. Shuby and Tila came over this morning early and during the forenoon I went and Charlie Lewis brought a ferret over. They were going to put him after the rats under the corncrib but he was so big he couldn't get into their holes. They burned the three corn shocks in the field but didn't get any there either. Shuby cleaned

ditches most of the afternoon in the sown field. He got a toad and put on the front lawn to eat ants. Dick was better to day and was downtown this afternoon, but Frank is all in to-day. He took the lawn mower down to be sharpened but feels tough. Quite cold to-day but mostly sunny.

Sunday May 24<sup>th</sup>

I haven't been off the place all day. I intended to go to church to-night but went to sleep before tea so couldn't get ready in time. Dad and Enah & Giddens drove down with Fred & Ginger this morning. They left Giddens with Shuby while they went to church and Shuby took him up to the dam in the scow. There was no organist at church till Enah got there so she had to go down to night again alone. Cloa has quit for sure. I sat around and read nearly all day. This morning when I took the eggs out of the incubator to cool them I could hear the chickens peeping and one or two eggs chipped. To-night one chick is out. Dick got up and went to church this morning stayed at Shuby's to dinner downtown all the afternoon and came home to tea to-night. Frank went down to church and a Sunday school this morning and back to the gully this afternoon to work day.
