Mr Turner's Cannons Island 17<sup>th</sup> Nov  
Went to Dundee very foggy on the River. Saw  
to Mr Long 2 Terns of Butter to amount of \$100  
\$7.13 " 48 " 27 to Cash 5.12.13 " 6.8 to Randolph  
Balance on Books 50 Pounds 50 Pennies 50 Scotch cap 70 Sol  
Sack of Fine Salt 65 2 Pairs of Hinges 30 1 lb of wrought  
nails by Rope 23 Axe 30 2 lbs of Cut Nails 8 1 lb of  
Powder 40 3 lbs of Shot 25 pair of Needles 5 Cash 1  
1/2 Bit Stock 80 Auger Bit 30 all this settled Bought  
On Credit 53 yds of Cotton at 5 cents yard 4 " 77

Bought of Mr Smallman flour 3 20 yds of Calico 1/2 yard  
of Calico 1 oil 15<sup>c</sup> Settled with Alexander S. Young  
to this Date Bought of Mr Long Soda 8 1 Box of Blue 5  
1 Box of Blue 10 Pipe 50 1/2 yd of close Fins 4 Matches 8  
Thimble 2 Thread (all this) (Bought of Mr Long Brown 25  
paid this) Windy & cold at Lake George all snow  
Traded caps with B. Lly 18 came home 15<sup>th</sup> cutting  
brush in the oak field 20<sup>th</sup> Brushing 21<sup>st</sup>  
On this Day of The Month Mr. Master Departed  
1841 18<sup>th</sup> Hamilton I. Caring S. Jack and Mr Adams here after  
their Hams took 1 of them left the other high & dry  
23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday Windy 24<sup>th</sup> Bohemian Went down on the  
last trip chopping on the Ritt Point found a vessel  
in a Dead Spruce Dead 25<sup>th</sup> snowing Windy put in cattle  
to night a steamer went up to night 26<sup>th</sup> The  
Massena stopped with the ice on the mouth of Salmon  
River turned back to Duquesne Ward (left all)  
a steamer went up feeding cattle 27<sup>th</sup> Massena  
Broke the ice in to Salmon River came out  
to day snowing 28<sup>th</sup> Randolph crossed for mail  
Bought of Mr Ward on credit a Lock 25<sup>th</sup> 10 2 Spools  
Thread 10 pence each (no light in its place) 25<sup>th</sup> at Stone  
30<sup>th</sup> st 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Day the festival of the  
Sutton 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday in advent 1<sup>st</sup> of December  
keeping St Andrews Day our Patron Saint  
all the Boys had shooting

a Pigeon came on the

Mr Turner's Cameron Island 2<sup>nd</sup> of December  
Chopping Logs for Boards setting handles for Reck  
Drew 3 Logs to the Grove put the calves in their  
own stable 4<sup>th</sup> put Hinges on 2 Doors clearing the  
trees and brush away at the Tent Windy but  
the warm snow about gone Freezing some to night  
not many ducks but a great lot went east  
this evening in flocks the Boys got a small lunge  
and tuple 1 Perch in the Black Bay 5<sup>th</sup> Very fine  
dry clapping Brush on the Lower Point water  
Snow cutting and Brushing in the oak field  
Back of the Barn Enclosed making  
a Board-Sleigh for 2 Wind got a Rat &  
it Wet Wind Rained Hard to night snow  
some water raised 8<sup>th</sup> snowing blowing  
Brushing some tied the fence  
put shaft on the Board-Sleigh a  
small Blue Bird following the cows and  
will light on their backs and keeps  
close to them when they are feeding in  
field or in the Barn-yard he was here  
3 or 4 days last week looks like a  
small Blackbird 9<sup>th</sup> cleaned the pipes

10<sup>th</sup> Leander's Birth Day 1872 gave him a silver  
Dollar cutting Brush a Boat crossing to Lancaster  
Below Butternut Island drawing Wood 11<sup>th</sup> stormy  
snowing soft tied the calves went around the Island  
lots of dead little fish like minnows around the shore  
it must be those fish they just in the River  
like Whitefish or Manhattan 12<sup>th</sup> drawing Wood  
13<sup>th</sup> cutting Brush in the oak field 14<sup>th</sup> fine 15<sup>th</sup>  
Cutting on the Ritt Point scattered trees 2 Wind  
changed to High West Wind Drew some Wood  
Hay all done on the Barn floor 16<sup>th</sup> a Boat  
passed with 2 in it going down to Ranken
