

January 1889.

Mon Jan 14 cloudy part of the day and pleasant. we were putting up grain to get chopt in the fore noon. after noon was cutting stove wood.

Tue Jan 15 cloudy and moderate. I took a load of grain to Mill to get chopt.

Wed Jan 16 cloudy and wet. has rained since 11 a. m. steady. I went for the feed this fore noon got wet before I got home.

Thu Jan 17 cloudy fore part of the day latter part clear. there was thunder and lightning last night. we were sawing wood this after noon. I paid Amada Drenan this morn- ing for keeping horse for us, Maggie Brownlee commenced house for us last night.

Fri Jan 18 cloudy and cold. the river almost bank full. four times the ice has gone out of the river already the mud froze solid again. we were sawing wood part of the day.

January 1889

Sat Jan 19 clear and cold. not doing much to day. Walter took Amada Drenan home this after noon. Sun Jan 20 cloudy and snow most of the day commencing to rain this evening.

Mon Jan 21 clear part of the day and cool. it turned cold in the night a few sleighs on the road to day the first for this season. I was carrying straw in the barn from the stack this fore noon. after noon we were sawing stove wood.

Tue Jan 22 clear and pleasant. we were sawing wood.

Wed Jan 23 clear and warm. we sawing wood again.

Thu Jan 24 clear and warm. we were taking straw in the barn from the stack this fore noon. after noon was cutting stove wood. the bit of snow there was on the ground is about all gone again. the roads are quite sloppy.

Fri Jan 25 clear and warm like April wether. we were cutting stove wood most of the day.
