

At Mill at Camp Monday 12th March 1880

On this Day of the month I with Master
Fitz Coigne to the Island Fine Wind Randolph
crossed got 50 lb of Flour at Mr Ward's got
the Loan of Mr Charles Craig's Sugar Pot
Cutting Wood and Brush for the Cods got
2 papers at Hamiltons for some
Wood cutting Stone Wood 13th Fine Wind
an Cool Sap Runs as Randolph has a Tree Sapper
Took Medicines to Day 14th Still Mr's Bork Day
1880 Fine Randolph much dep to the Sugar Bush
cut y Pole Firing the Barrels and Pots and Chains
to have them all ready sent Randolph over to
see young Henry Bosell to see if he wanted
the Sugar Bush 15th Henry came said he would
take the Bush going to Day to look for a Seam for
to draw wood for the camp Hamilton
here a Fine Day of Good Mr. Dore all here
and son for the Bush and told him
I gave it to Henry 16th Fine Day cutting brush
for the camp 17th chopper went to Hamiltons
18th cutting brush with him I did Rained hard
to night not a Stormy Day but Patrick 18th
in the Bush a Fine Day slopy in the swamp
19th a Fine Day 3 Wind went to Summers town Bought
Mr Ward 100^{wt} of Flour 3.25 5 lb Tea 25 1/2 lb Tea 15
Pail 20. 5 lb of Mince 25 Matches Pipe Bought of Sumner
R R R 25 Sweets Got 2 Bagg of Tobacco from
Hamiltons The C/O Trappers (Russell killed
Little Jim the Dougalls since departed in Mona Island
Mr Craigs Boys Frank Laphantes and St. Dennis's
Boys Run away caught some of them in Fort-
Covington see Mellins on the Sap and Hearing
under suppose Heard a Seam got drowned
up of possible Mr. Martins a Man from
Barrington to them I took Crows
Black Birds came

Mr. Smith's Amusement 30th March 1881
Raining Snowing & Wind First Day Spring 21st
Fine Randolph crossed to Rossells for word
George left his Boy to McDougall
to tell him Young Henry or Wall Eye
was not going to take the Sugar Bush
so he said he would come tomorrow some of
the hens commenced today for the first
a Large flock of wild Geese went down
past close to the Barn 22nd Livonia's
(Birth Day Senior) Roy Willie and James Cox came to
Draw Wood for the sugar Bush drawing stones
to make a place for an arch in place of logs 23rd
Took some for the first putting out some
Manure Fine Weather 24th Gathering and Boiling
All night 25th Annunciation of the Virgin Mary
Made the first sugar about 6 o'clock the Boys
Randolph and Bernard had a great feast in the
Bush Brought letters to the house
L Co about opening at Frances
Island where it always opens first
2 to 10th John H C Birth Day a fine
Day 1876 Sugaring to day about 26 lbs
did not come well of the moles Tom
Cox and Willie McDougall slept to
night for the first had they tick with
them 27th Sunday June 10th Willie here
all day snowed some Thawed some
Gathered about 30 pails 28th Fine
Wind high Raw Boiling cutting Branch
A Cutter crossed Summer Road
this morning Roy Willie McDougall
came across and went back shot a
squirrel 29th About this time James Williams
departed on the King Road chopping Stone Wood
30th Ice opening slowly Sugaring in the Bush 31st
the Bush cutting Wood for the camp
about the 28th So beyond Child departed
