 at 4 P. M. Murdy drove Mrs Tate to Lancaster Miss Macintosh called and took Marion to stay until tomorrow 70 butter 35^{cts} 35
- 22 An ugly day snow and rain. Only Jimmie from our house in church. No preaching, or prayer meeting in St Andrew's church.
- 23 Fine day in morning. turned to rain. rained heavily all afternoon. Jimmie loaded the privy in morning. Marion baked four mince pies and made fruit cake. made plum pudding and one fruit cake. boiled it for an hour. Then baked for an hour. 70 25 lbs flour 25
 3 lb raisins 25 Vanilla 10 Citron peel 13

- 24 Returned the brooms and took two with basket handles - 60
- 25 Fine day. we were alone to dinner
- 26 I got home this evening from Burdies, and it is snowing heavily. with cold wind from the west. I went on the 26th with Farquhar, who was going to Cornwall. He came back that night for there was a man coming next day to try and open J. H. Brown's safe. Clara Kennedy was four nights with Marion. It began to storm and rain on Friday 27th and by Saturday night there was very little snow on the roads. Sunday it was very sleazy, and it was buggy they were using. Monday Far went to Cornwall. Came back tonight. Mrs Pigeon paid one month's rent 3⁰⁰. They got bread twice 48^{cts} butter matches 40
 When Brown's safe was opened there was no will
