 roads pretty badly blocked, 23<sup>rd</sup> very cold this morning  
 18<sup>deg</sup> below zero 22 at noon & 33 below zero at night -  
 24<sup>th</sup> about the same this morning as last night - gets  
 milder towards noon, still very frosty this evening;  
 25<sup>th</sup> fine morning Alex Watt went to Aspmonte  
 Betsy Evens died this evening between 6 & 7 Diphtheria  
 only had 4 days 26<sup>th</sup> soft Day making a coffin for  
 Betsy Evens, 27<sup>th</sup> fine Day the roads are pretty very  
 got a letter from Robert P. Affleck Elizabeth went  
 to Darling this evening 28<sup>th</sup> stormy this evening 29 cold  
 30<sup>th</sup> Matthew Munroe died about 10 o'clock this morning  
 made Coffin after night - 31<sup>st</sup> fine day like Spring  
 February! Matthew Munroe buried at 1 o'clock, very fine  
 Day snowing a little this evening 2<sup>nd</sup> fine Day  
 3 pretty cold the Boys had a concert this evening  
 10<sup>th</sup> fine Ellen & Ann Watt from Palmerston was here to  
 Day took them to James Robertson in the evening
