

alarm clock. I wanted to get out any way before the ~~birds~~ did as I discovered yesterday that the old duck was laying in the chicken yard and so I wanted to leave the yard open for her to get in during the night but as I don't let the same pen out two days in succession I had to get up before the birds to shut it up. I didn't think to shut them in the house but I will here after I hope. Dick brought home a bird last night that Mr. Shables wanted two settings of eggs so I went over to ask Jack Martin if he wanted them especially but he wasn't home and Chis was down town so I sent them over. Vige was over for awhile after breakfast Shuby got the brush heap on the orchard burned at last. I threw the brush out of the ~~bird~~ yard and helped him carry it over to the fire. After we burned it we started to clean up the wheat. We got it all cleaned by about half past four this afternoon. There was only about forty bushels of it cleaned. we put a coarse sieve in the bottom so got a lot of chaff in the sift box nearly enough to fill up the chicken feed bin. When we got it done Shuby and I tore down and piled up boards to where we could get them with the wagon what few rails were left from the old barn yard fence. Snowy but raw wind all day. Sam Law was on his field to day but Tom Abbot says it is very mushy. Poor Tiddums is very miserable, the whooping cough is back again.

Saturday May 14th

Lila came over with Shuby first thing this morning and has been over all day. Jim Bannister sent over word with them for Dad to come over as his mare was just foaling. Dad. has been over two or three times during the day and is there now with Frank. Bert is there from Simcoe, and Dad. says his is afraid Jim will lose the mare, the colt I think is dead. Dad. and I hauled up a load of rails this morning from the old barn yard fence and then took the wheat to the mill. We made two trips of it and took down three sacks of oats for chaff, we had 44 bushels and 14 lbs of wheat and it is just a dollar a bushel so we did gain a little by waiting after all. After dinner Shuby and I went back to the woods and were gone nearly all the afternoon but we got a beautiful little elm and set it out here near the dinner house and just behind the anchor post for this lane fence, we got it out in the open and it is a perfect shape ~~sook~~ as we didn't cut much of the top off it will be pretty from the first. Grant and Lila went back with us but went the other way when we got to the gully and got a lot of flowers and some merels which Shuby found the other day and told them about. Our little tree was all out in leaf but Shuby took great pains in planting it and he thinks
