

1865 Feb 1st Dr. Jones gave twenty dollars towards the premiums

- Feb 16 Sowed 3 1/4 bushels of Rye in the North East corner
of the farm where we used to summer fallow in the
forenoon Billie plow'd the afternoon I went to the
Rev Mr White & took the oath of W Robinson & A. B. London
to a statement about the height of the g. T. R. W fence
17 plow'd in the northeast part of the place
18 finished plowin' it all but middle head ^{lond by}
noon Billie Alice Isabella went to young in the
19 the Rev Mr White preached in the schoolhouse in the fore-
noon & the Rev Mr Corrol in the afternoon in the church
Cleaned out boat with a furnace at the North East
end of the farm where I plow'd Billie came home
from young & brought a ram lamb from George
20 plow'd a large ridge between the field Rye & that was
so near a fallow then I sowed the furrow it snowed
& rained all the day I got out & before 12 o'clock
21 made better than a half barrel of croat ^{grated} snow
22 2 loads of wood with the slough no frost
23 cleaned the Spring Rye lois & basket with 2 loads
I will want at least four bushels for each basket
24 the snow nearly all gone let off a great deal of
water of the fields fine day
25 no meeting to day
26 I attended the Council Samuel Johnson is
trying to get out of from our School section
Messenger Dorlin a Coak hear all night
27 attended again to day hard frost with a little
28 worked at a little house yesterday
29 killed the hogs Bumper Younger
helped the frost is nearly all gone again
a little rain to night

March 1st the snow is all gone some time a man
came along & took my sled & I got him to give me
it back & he said I must pay him
